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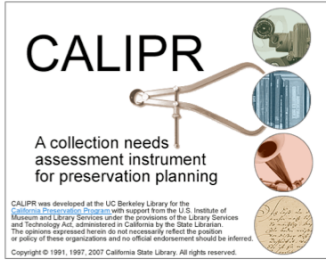
Statewide planning services

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California A/V assessment

- 32 institutions / 1.1 million recordings
- priorities for action
 - write disaster plans for collections
 - catalog backlogs
 - educate to reduce damage
 - reformat high/value high risk recordings
 - develop a digital preservation program

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Services in development

- cross-agency partnerships for disaster prep
- digital preservation training
- collaboration to catalog “hidden” collections
- planning for all “heritage” institutions

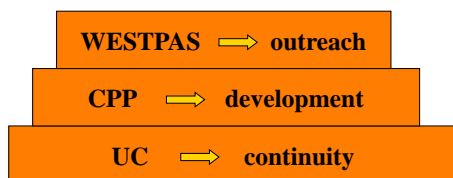
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CPP and WESTPAS organization model

- steering ctte. from communities served

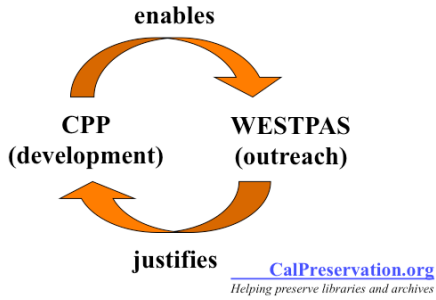
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Organizational Building Blocks



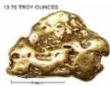
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A “growth” relationship
