

Exercise #2

Print and Date ()

In this exercise you will practice the print statement and the date() function.

A. Use the print statement to create a header

1. Open search.php in Notepad, and go to the comment/header called Header.
2. Use the print statement to create a header for the results screen for our obituary database.
3. Put the header in a larger size embedding the HTML inside the PHP print command.
4. Save the file to your desktop.
5. Copy the file and paste it into your sub-directory on the remote server.
6. If you like, view your new results screen header in the browser by going to **<http://phpclass.infopeople.org/yourname/search.php>**.

B. Add a date display to search.php

1. Decide on the format for the display of the date in search.php.
2. Use the handout called “Displaying the Date using Date()” to write the code to display the date in search.php under the comment/header Show Date.
3. Save the file to your desktop.
4. Copy the file and paste it into your sub-directory on the remote server.
5. View it in the browser by going to **<http://phpclass.infopeople.org/yourname/search.php>**
