

Text Chat Transcript for Dec 18, 2014 Webinar: Making It Count: California Library Statistics Online

Jamie McGrath: While digital data is great for researching specific questions, the printed version of CSL statistics is much easier to view for comparative information. Will there be printed versions available in the traditional format?

Darla Gunning (CSL): Jamie, at this time there is not a plan for continuing the print version. This was announced at the director's forum last year. Grace: what do you use to count visitors? do you have a door count or some one keeps track of people coming in?

Milly Lugo-Rios: When odd entries are posted in the statistics, is there someone at CSL who picks up on them and confirm with the library that the number is accurate?

Darla Gunning (CSL): Milly, we try to vet as much of the data as possible as does the US Census, but it is not always possible to catch all anomalies

Milly Lugo-Rios: I understand, thanks!

Darla Gunning (CSL): Grace, libraries at the branch level even may do this very differently. Random sampling is suggested if there is no door count mechanism (such as through security gates.)

Darla Gunning (CSL): Milly, having these new reports also help highlight those outliers!!!!

Milly Lugo-Rios: You are right, Darla! If the data is vital for our report, we can always contact the library directly, as that info appears on the reports, as well.

Grace:thank you Darla.

Norma Angel:Hello. Is our login the same as for the annual survey?

Darla Gunning (CSL):Norma, no it is completely separate (a different vendor.)

Norma Angel:Ok. Who should I contact for this info?

Darla Gunning (CSL):me

Norma Angel:Will do. Thanks

Alameda Public Library:Is there a way to resolve errors in the data from this/previous years?

Eileen O'Shea:we can see your screen!

Darla Gunning (CSL):We have corrected up until it is finalized with IMLS/US Census, and then it is locked. At that point the federal reports are made available and is what is used nationally. We have felt it was important not to change because the public would get inconsistent data for the same period of time. Not sure how to resolve that but may be a topic the task force could discuss.
