- Instant messaging





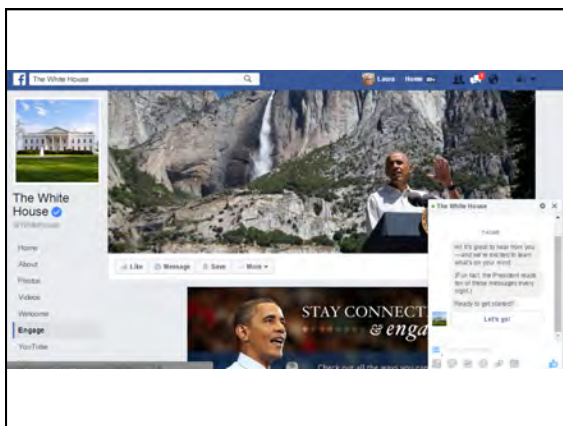

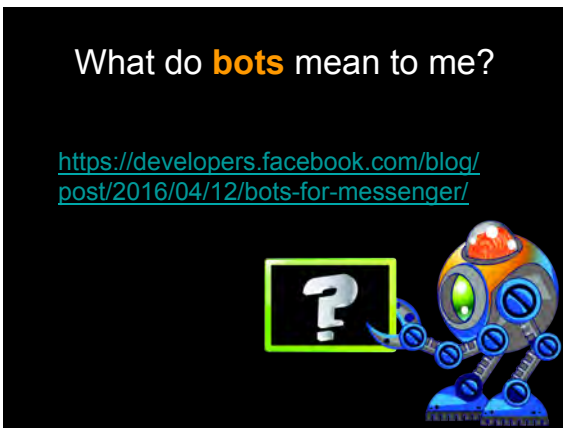

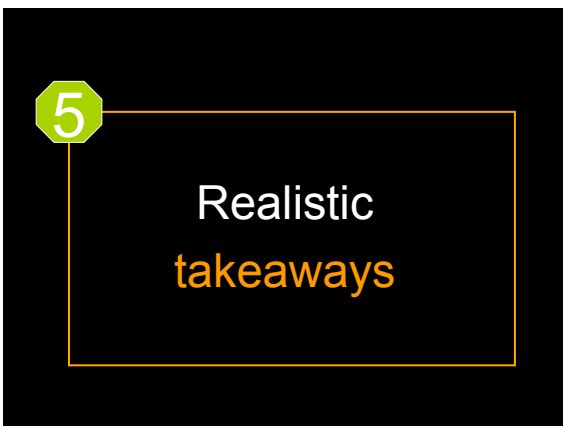
