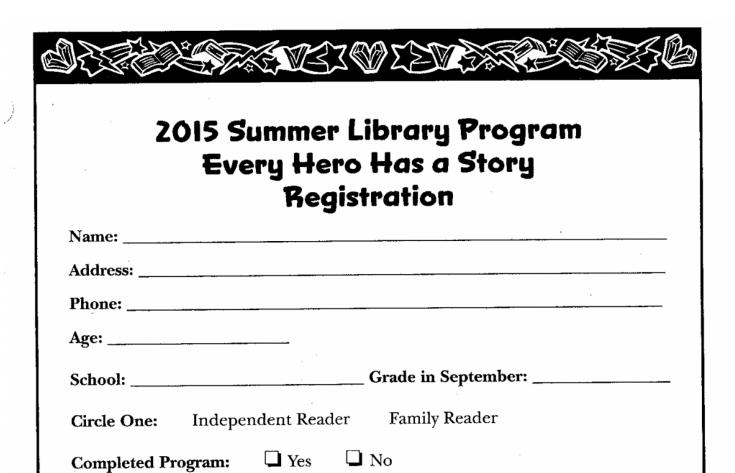

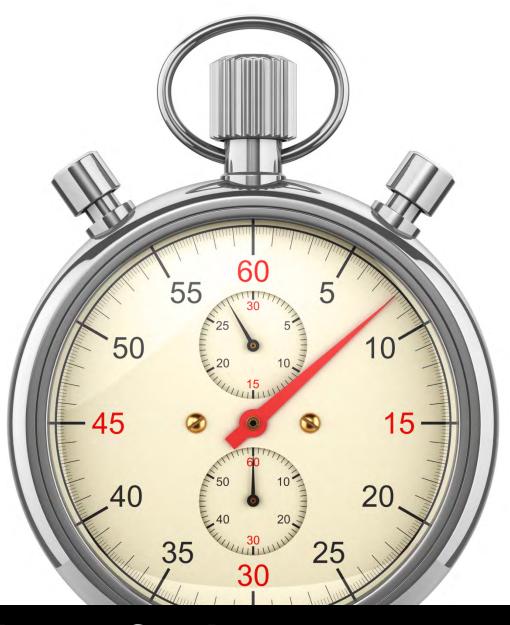

- Reduced risk of dementia
